| Background | <p>During the development the United Nations Development Framework (UNDAF) 2018-2022, the UN in Kenya conducted a Common Country Assessment (CCA) as part of the development process aimed at informing its theory of change, visioning exercise and the results framework targets and benchmarks. The new United Nations Sustainable Development Cooperation Framework (UNSDCF) requires the CCA to be kept light and regularly updated to track and reflect situational developments. The UN agencies has therefore embarked on the process of reviewing and updating the CCA. This will be informed by rigorous analysis to inform evidence -based programming -especially within the COVID-19 Pandemic and the UN comparative advantage.</p> <p>UNFPA Kenya country office will develop a light Population Situation Analysis (PSA) that will anchor the three transformative result - Ending Preventable maternal deaths, Ending unmet need for family planning and Ending gender-based violence and harmful practices- into the CCA, UNSDCF and CPD development.</p> |
| Purpose of consultancy: | To conduct a light Population Situation Analysis on UNFPA mandate areas and prepare a report as a UNFPA contribution to UN CCA. |
| Scope of work Description of services, activities or outputs: | <p>The development of the report will broadly be guided by the UN CCA guidelines.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The analysis should also examine the country’s progress towards the 2030 Agenda, looking at the existing country situation, short, medium and long-term needs, vulnerabilities and risks • The report will provide a concise overview of the country’s standing in each of UNFPA’s Transformative Results as they relate to the dimensions of sustainable development (economic, social and environmental), reflecting on national development priorities. • The report should identify the gaps, connections, synergies and potential trade-offs among SDGs, across the social, economic and environmental dimensions of sustainable development. • It should include an analysis of interlinked sustainable development challenges and opportunities, across a breadth of thematic or sectoral issues • The report should provide an analysis of SDG Financing Landscape with a particular emphasis on SDG within UNFPA mandate • Leaving no, one behind, Human Rights, Gender Equality and Women’s Empowerment: - The report should place specific attention on the most vulnerable populations and the factors affecting their capacity to claim their rights |

and benefit from the country's development gains. It includes a rights-based analysis of root causes and drivers, and a multidimensional analysis of interconnected risks driving people's vulnerability.
